

## Special Rule for Dennis Olson and Kaercher League Play

### "Side Line Control"

This rule would become effective with the beginning of the 2007/2008 Season of play. This rule is for league games played in the above referenced leagues.

"The first time the referee of a game has to go over and stop the dissent from a team's coach, team officials, or parents associated with the team the referee will give an oral warning. The second time the referee has to go over to the touchline to deal with dissent from a team's coaches, team officials, and/or parents, the referee shall restart the game with a penalty kick for the opposing team." If the referee has to return at any time during the remainder of the game again because of dissent from the team's coaches, team officials, or parents the referee shall restart the game with a penalty kick for the opposing team. The referee may "send off" a person on the sideline at any time for "dissent". Even if the referee has stopped the game for a foul of any kind, or the ball going out of bounds regardless of who would have taken the free kick or the throw in the "dissent" penalty kick shall take precedent over any other restart of play in this restart situation." The referee may take additional action against the team that is causing the problem including issuing cautions, red cards, or sending off adults including coaches and team officials at any time during the game.

The referee shall show on the game card how many times a "penalty kick" for "dissent" was awarded against a team during the game. This should show on the game card just like a "caution" or "send off" would be shown against a player. It needs to be a part of the "game report" and should include at what time during the game the "dissent" penalty was given and indicate which team was penalized.
